

Up until now, we have been dealing with 1-syllable verbs. For 2-syllable verbs the present tense rule is exactly the same, but the endings are different.

Examples of 2-syllable verbs are:

Ceannáigh = to buy  
Críochnáigh = to finish  
Bailígh = to gather  
Cuidígh = to help.

} infinitives

Above, you have been given the infinitive of some verbs. To create the stem, you just knock off either the -igh or the -aigh. Here are some examples:

Infinitive:

Ceannáigh → ceann  
Críochnáigh → críochn  
Bailígh → bail  
Cuidígh → cuid

stem:

Present tense endings for 2-syllable verbs.

Broad:

- aím
- aíonn tú
- aíonn sé / sí
- aímíd
- aíonn sibh
- aíonn siad.

Slender:

- ím
- ionn tú
- ionn sé / sí
- ímid
- ionn sibh
- ionn siad.

Examples -

I buy = ceannáim B+B  
He helps = cuidíonn sé / sí
